December is one of the most festive and beautiful times of the year. It is the season of new light at a time in the northern hemisphere when it appears to be most dark. In the darkest night of the darkest period, we celebrate the coming of the light!

are the envy of the neighborhood. Let the light penetrate inward, for on there will it have lasting benefit. One candle lit with a pure heart, a conscious mind, and an earnest desire to be free from ignorance is far brighter than 10,000 colored lights strung on rooftops and lit in unconscious revelry.

Christmas is a holiday of joy, when we gather with loved ones, celebrating with our family, our friends, and the prosperity God has bestowed upon us.

The second meaning of Christmas celebrated at the end of the old year is a "making room" for the new. The symbol of Jesus being born in a stable, for there was no room for him in the inn, is very interesting.

In order to truly make room for a New Year, new understanding, and new consciousness, we must make room, clean up, and finish with the past. The accumulation of beliefs, debts, and rationalizations that clutter our minds. our consciousness, and our relationships must be put to rest. Then, the inner stillness and uncluttered spaces of the mind make room for new birth or new understanding, where intuitive listening can be born in us to take us into the next phase of our journey. Then the light of Christ can enter all the corners of our lives. We begin new calendars, new diaries, closing the accounts for the past year, and making ready

year. Last year our total income was \$94,358.28, of which \$71,232.64 was the Sunday/mailin tithes. I compared this to the previous year (fiscal year 2003-2004), when our total income was \$110,707.40. Of that amount, \$84,813.18 was the Sunday/mailin tithes. That's a difference of \$13,580.54.

we made it through this last year. Two major things happened: the Mariners fundraiser brought in around \$7,000, and

Richard's leaving dropped the payroll and payroll taxes in half. At the moment, Margie Hyatt is our only employee.

Each month we have included in the newsletter the balance on the current bills, as well as the loan and credit card balances. From October 2004 to June 2005, we really struggled to pay all the bills and taxes. We made up the difference by borrowing on the credit card, which is why the balance is so high. We had a couple of fantastic fundraisers over the summer—the Mariner's games (Continued on page 4) (Continued from page 3...From the Board) and the rummage sale—and we were able to bring the bills up to date. However, we were unable to put a dent into the credit card balance. At the annual meeting, the congregation approved the Board's putting together a package to get a loan for at least \$30,000, and up to \$100,000. The \$30,000 will pay off the credit card bill and Kitsap bank loan, with a much lower interest rate. Once the package has been put together, we will present it to the congregation.

I am truly confident that all is in divine order and the Universe will supply our every need here at West Sound Unity. We are truly blessed in having Max Lafser come to our church for the next year. He has a wonderful vision for our beautiful church. and I'm looking forward to working with him as a board member.

I want to finish this article by quoting these words from the *Daily Word*: "I unite with others in creating a beacon of peace that illumines the world."

dar screen, meaning that we haven't been detectable by obvious measurable means. Reality is that we have been holding "spiritual space" for limitless possibilities, while the physical reality shifted in various ways such as

Richard and Daryl leaving to follow their dreams, and Margie and Max stepping into the space to allow us all to have a sense of those possibilities.

We all believe in the power of prayer; but I know that I sometimes question and test the waters, and it is at those times that my world seems to shake under my feet. I had the opportunity in Brazil to experience many miracles first hand and have come to KNOW upfront and personal the healing power of God working in my life through the power of prayer. Once again I want to reach out and help you remember that this Chaplain Program is in place for you to share your concerns and gratitudes and reinforce that connection to God.

Chaplains are available on Sundays for prayer. We also are available for home and hospital visits for you or your loved ones and for memorial services, community disaster situations, etc.

I recently completed a "train the trainer" program in Disaster Preparedness Training, and we are exploring how we can be a beacon of light and share this light within our extended community in times of turmoil.

With all that has been happening within the church, and all the ways that we can share our "secret" of the power of prayer with others, we have decided to have another Chaplain training and retreat at my home in January 2006. This will be an opportunity for current Chaplains to "reup," as well as support anyone else who is called to be a Chaplain. Current Chaplains who decide not to attend will become "Chaplain Emeritus" at that time.

January seems to be a great time for new beginnings and to set our intention for the Chaplain Program and West Sound Unity Church. I hope that in those quiet moments you will listen to God's voice within and see if being a Chaplain is a "fit" for you. If you feel called to serve in this way, please contact me for details.
