- To serve God and humanity by holding a consciousness of a healed world.
- To be in service to God and humanity through right thinking and a loving heart.
- To help awaken the mass of humanity that holds in its hands the goodness and salvation that the world requires.
- To co-create programs with boards, committees and congregations that contribute to personal and collective evolution.
- To build community within Unity through which the individual and the collective initiate centers of learning and information "link-up" with those on the spiritual path locally, nationally and internationally."

Affirmative Prayer

Prayer is the language of Love between the Creator and its Beloved.

Prayer is a spiritual practice that is as important to our souls as food is to our bodies. Affirmative Prayer, as we practice in Unity, is designed to help us create greater good in our lives and to work in conscious union with the Creative Source. The idea is to first make our desire real in our mind Then we will experience the outer results. As within, so without.

Begin by creating a statement of purpose for your life or another's: I now claim that I am...Living – Experiencing – Expressing – Embodying (choose one)...and complete the sentence. This statement is a brief, affirmative, declaration of the condition/situation you call into being in your life.

Examples: I now claim that I am living in total peace and harmony. I now claim that I am a whole and healthy child of God. I now claim that I am living a fully abundant life.

Five steps to Affirmative Prayer:

1. Recognition: GOD IS~

To "know again," to remember. In any healing we must first turn away from the appearances of the condition. With deep conviction, in your own words, identify the allness, oneness and wholeness—the highest concept of God. God is in, around, and through everyone and everything. There is only one Mind and that mind is God and that mind is you.

2. Unification ~ **I AM.** The concept of God that you name draws you toward the power of Love.

You seek to connect yourself with this power, this light, this Love. As Jesus said, "I and my Father are one."

3. Affirmation: THE TRUTH IS~

Affirm what you realize to be true about your relationship with God and align with that what you know to be true about yourself or another. This puts into the Universal Mind a greater Truth than you are currently experiencing, you transcend the condition or appearance.

4. Gratitude: THANK YOU~

Expressing the "attitude of gratitude" we give thanks, knowing the good is already taking form in your life or for the other for whom you pray. Give thanks for the answered prayer, for the result. And gratefully receive your good.

5. Release: I SURRENDER~

Clearly, completely release the power of your word, your creative agency, to the Universal Creative Medium, knowing that as you have spoken—it is done. Release in total faith and acceptance, allowing the Divine Wisdom and Order to do its right and perfect work in your life. You "let go and let God."

An important aspect to remember in prayer time is that we stay at the level of the solution and thus we refrain from problem solving and/or fixing. Do not discuss problems or get lost in the drama and the story of a situation. Rather see and know Truth for each other.


