## The journey continues

**Encircled by the arms of a mystery** By Reverend Max Lafser

Hildegarde of Bingen, a Benedictine nun from the middle ages, once said, "God hugs you. You are encircled by the arms of the mystery of God." Hildegarde was saying we are encircled by the arms of a mystery, which is always revealed to us as love.

My grandmother liked to read mystery novels. As a little boy I would get up on the bed with her while she read to me. I always marveled how this gentle, nonviolent woman could sit spellbound over some gory mystery tale.

In one sense, we are all somewhat like her. We cannot be content merely to experience, but must seek to make sense of our experiences—to know their cause and significance, to find out the truth behind the fact. We all want to penetrate the mystery, to figure out the plot so that in some measure we will figure out the author, or the plotter. We are not satisfied being told that God is a mystery that cannot be comprehended, only loved. Since each of us is created in the image of God, we have the same burning need to know our Creator, as an earthly child has to know its biological parents.

So when we attempt to penetrate the mystery of God, we may confuse something visible for God. Perhaps that is why we have Jesus, the Son of God, so we could see God? If this all sounds mysterious and somehow illusive, that is because that is what God is like, and all our best thinking and rational analysis will not reveal God to us.

The only way we will experience God will be as we feel ourselves loved. Then we become willing to say "Yes" to the mystery of being loved into aliveness. Thus we (Continued on page 2)

make our surrender to a God we can neither define, nor see, nor control. Our true relationship to God is not altered by the fact we cannot see or understand God clearly. When we absolutely and eagerly surrender ourselves to the will of God, even though God remains a mystery, we cease to writhe under a sense of deprivation and begin to assimilate the mystery into ourselves. We become loving.

Look, for example, at the New Year's celebration. All the noise and clamor are only a vestige of the myth of the eternal rhythms and the eternal return, the periodic destruction and recreation of the cosmos. There is a moment between the turning of the old year into the new, a mysterious interval where we have the opportunity to be renewed at the gate of something we do not understand, something that is mysteriously unknown.

This is illustrated in a children's story. A child asks Mary Poppins, "When does the old year end?" "On the first stroke of midnight," answers Mary. "And when does the new year begin?" asks the child. "On the last stroke of midnight," replies Mary. "What then," asks the child, "happens in between while the clock is striking 12?" For centuries in primitive religions, this moment was described as the ritual pause.

Come join us on Sunday, January 1, as we pause before the New Year, "Encircled By the Arms of a Mystery." January will be a special month of renewal for all of us. A blessed New Year is yours.


## In praise of song
