Open my eyes

I tore my house apart last week looking for my spare color ink cartridge. It wasn't where it should have been. After checking out my office area, I moved to the kitchen. Had I left it in a bag maybe? Back to the office/ bedroom. I looked on the ironing board, under the bed, in a box on the worktable. Zippo. I sat on my chair in front of the computer, wondering where else it could possibly be, when there it was sitting on top of my disc box. It was there, hidden in plain sight the whole time. What I'd been looking for was the familiar box, not the cartridge itself.

In *The Ladder*, a book of modern day parables by Edward Hays, he tells the story of a young man who is on his way to spend a few days at a spiritual retreat. The goal, he says, is to "encounter God." Remarking on the immenseness of his suitcase, his teacher says he may have diffi-

culty being naked before God.

"If you want not only the guest master but also God to meet you at the front gate, strip yourself of your agenda for your retreat. Unpack your books, tapes, and even your Bible. Strip yourself of your habitual ways of how you see, feel and think about yourself, how you think about your daily world and most of all, how you think about God. Unpack, as well, your attachments and preconceptions. Take nothing on retreat except the naked you, the old original you. If you can go on retreat in this way—completely naked—be assured that you will encounter God on the mountain."

There have been a few times in my life when I truly thought I'd be struck down by lightening for the thoughts that had entered my mind. The things we are taught to believe and do by our particu-

(Continued from page 1...Open my eyes) lar faith can be hard to dislodge. When a new perception gets a foothold in your thinking, and it's not along the lines you were taught, fear can rear its head and you proceed cautiously, if not disregarding it altogether.

We know, though, don't we, that if someone were to question the dogma of his or her faith to move to ours, well, that person would just be doing what's right. Right? If, however, you have come to know the still, small voice of your creator and you trust it, and it's

moving you off the highway, you know you must honor it no matter what others think of you. It's the only way you find peace.

It can be very difficult to strip yourself of the "habitual ways" you think about God. Often, all you have to do is suspend judgment on someone in order to increase the light—to see God's presence from another perspective. God can be hiding in plain sight, just in a different wrapper. God has much more to reveal to us, if only we have eyes to see and ears to hear.





The Consciousness of The Christ: Reclaiming Jesus for a New Humanity

It seems that in American culture, Jesus is bigger than ever, with all sorts of diverse takes on the one they call the Christ.

While Rick Warren's fundamentalist inspired book, *The Purpose Driven Life*, lingered long atop the nonfiction bestseller list, *The DaVinci Code*, Dan Brown's speculation about the relationship between Jesus and Mary Magdalene, broke records atop the bestseller list for fiction. Buoyed by churchgoers who came out in droves to see it multiple times, Mel Gibson's *The Passion of The Christ* was the film phenomenon of last year. Next year the film version of *The Da Vinci Code*, directed by Ron Howard, will hit the screen.

Now, from *Heaven on Earth Films*, comes **The Consciousness of the Christ: Reclaiming Jesus For a New Humanity**. The documentary not only tells the story of the historical Jesus, with locations along the ancient paths of the Sea of Galilee, it catapults the Christ message into a divine human destiny that exists both here and now and far into our evolutionary future.

"What is called the 'Second Coming' is the illuminating holy fire of many of us united in love and forgiveness," director and narrator Kell Kearns announces in the opening frames. "We are a vanguard of global transformation heralding a destiny of love." A beautiful Palestinian child dances into the camera down a stone street in Old Jerusalem: and the scene dissolves to the Sea of Galilee where Jesus sits with his disciples, describing a Kingdom free of death, in which wisdom and self knowledge in union with God lifts humanity to its true identity. Insights and illuminations come at every turn in The **Consciousness of The Christ.** The visuals are mystic, with parallels between our time, Jesus' time, a future of unimaginable promise, and an eternal universe of love, which is the human inheritance. Audiences leave in a state of contemplative affirmation.

The onscreen commentators are some of the most gifted voices today for living The Christ mind. Four-time best-selling author, Marianne Williamson, speaks of the empowerment of forgiveness, and the process of conforming to the Christ nature. Mystic

scholar and activist Andrew Harvey passionately takes the audience through the thresholds of transformation leading to Christhood. Noted author and lecturer Barbara Marx Hubbard brilliantly describes the process of Conscious Evolution and divinization of humanity. Gladys McGarey, former President and founding Member of the American Holistic Health Association, speaks of the healing power of Christ energy, which she refers to as the physician within.

We have brought to this effort the latest scholarly research into the historical Jesus, and the latest scriptural interpretations from sources such as the Jesus Seminar that focus on the actual sayings of the Christ rather than the later redactions that overlay those sayings. Interwoven into the retelling of Jesus' story is commentary by some of finest authors and lecturers today on Christ consciousness.

And, I must say a few words about the experience of shooting on location in Israel, especially along the shores of the Sea of Galilee where Jesus first announced the coming of the New Humanity. There is something very special about the place and I hope that it comes through the lens. Like other sacred places of the world it seems imbued even today with the consciousness of the divine being who once walked there to proclaim our universal divinity. One can peer through a thin veil and almost see the great teacher walking the paths between the villages of Galilee, announcing the New Humanity, showing the way to self-healing, radically imploring us to love our enemies, declaring that peacemakers are the very sons and daughters of God, perfectly in God's image, and insisting that heaven is here, now, among us.

However you may be coming into your own God nature, may *The Consciousness of The Christ* strengthen you, affirm you and bring you the courage of endless love.
