Putting on the brakes

There were two men riding a bicycle built for two up a big steep hill, and it proved to be a very stiff climb. After a terrible struggle to get to the top, the man in front turned to the other man and said, "Boy, that was hardest climb I've ever done!" The guy in back replied, "Yeah, and if I hadn't kept the brakes on all the way, we would have rolled back down!"

I've had experiences like that, riding all by myself. I sometimes look forward in anticipation, jumping on the pedals and slamming on the brakes at the same time. That may sound difficult, but it's not. Occasionally I embrace a new challenge of some sort, take action to make it happen, and at the same time take other steps to make sure it fails.

The first action I initiate consciously with confidence and a positive attitude, and the second

I initiate unconsciously with doubt and fear. The rider on the front of the bike built for two is the conscious one, making decisions and steering. The one on the back is the unconscious, reacting to fear and putting on the brakes. The problem is I can't see the rider in the back, and I can't see the unconscious. I have to consciously monitor my progress so the brakes aren't on.

The way to make sure the brakes aren't on in life is to regularly look for roadblocks and ask yourself how they got there. If I'm looking for a new job, doing all I need to do by researching the internet or library, reading want ads, and sending out resumes—but also using those activities to avoid actually going out and asking someone to hire me—I may be putting on the brakes. If I want a relationship and am spending

(Continued from page 1...Resistance is futile) time with people who aren't available, being in activities that keep me home, or prejudging everyone I meet, I may be braking for all I'm worth because of fear. Take your foot off the brakes!

This calls for honest, even brutal, self-awareness. Difficult questions must be asked. Are you afraid of being successful? Are you doing all you can to be successful? Are you putting up road blocks? Do you have the brake pedal firmly to the floor? If the answer is "Yes," then the next step is to make Christ your

partner, meaning you consciously decide God is present within you and interested in your happiness and well-being and working every moment in your behalf. This is as true as anything in the universe can be true, and if you believe it, you will experience that truth in your life.

The truth is you can make God your partner in pedaling through life—and God is quite willing to pedal with you, unless your fear instructs Him to do otherwise.

Throw away your fear and tell God, "No more putting on the brakes—let's pedal!"

Charles Fillmore, for many years resisted the idea of forming a church based on the "new thought" teachings he and Myrtle practiced and shared in the form of "Unity School of Practical Christianity."

There came a point when it was clear that organizing as a denomination and building a church was the appropriate choice. The lore of this history goes that at this decision point someone tossed a penny across the room to Mr. Fillmore saying, "Here's the start of the building fund." That penny can be found in the Unity ar-

chives, taped to a note card with this affirmation written by Charles Fillmore:

"The inexhaustible resource of Spirit is equal to every demand. There is no reality in lack. Abundance is here and now manifest."

From this single penny grew the campus of Unity Village, a location that was at one time a fully self-sustaining "farm" and is now a location with its own zip code. I believe this illustrates for us the power of intention, of moving in the direction of a goal. It is evidence that Universal energy and substance is drawn by the action, not the amount — that it simply takes a demonstration of faith to open the door to receiving. Adding action to intention says, "I have faith."




