Road trip

I have another trip down a long road ahead of me. I have an even longer one behind me. It is the same for West Sound Unity.

The road this church has traveled is almost as long as the one I've rolled on down during this lifetime. West Sound Unity (Unity Church of Bremerton at that time) was founded in 1943, one year after I was born. (Yes, I was born in 1942, although I don't feel nearly that old.)

Marion Brown founded this church and guided it through the growing years, until it was large enough for the congregation to build its own (completed in 1964). Marion served for about 26 years. I arrived in 1997, after a long string of ministers, who averaged a little over two years of service each. The longest stay was about six years. I have been here over eight years, and I am pleased about that and grateful. I am leaving West Sound Unity Church after these eight years because I feel the call of Spirit to do so. We have been challenged financially most of the time I have served here. Last December, someone said to me, "Something has to change. We need to do something." This is my greatest disappointment – that I couldn't find the key to unlocking our financial prosperity. When I heard this comment, it triggered something in my soul. I knew, at that moment, that it was time for me to leave. It was time for the church to open its heart to someone else who would take it to the next step.

Please note that I mentioned "financial prosperity." I believe we have prospered in many other ways. I believe there has been a healing in this church during these eight years, and that the
